

The Microban® Language

Approved terminology varies by geographic location. To ensure compliance with Microban® approved language by region, here are approved and prohibited qualifiers, along with some example claims that can be made.

APPROVED QUALIFIERS & TERMINOLOGY

APPROVED Primary Qualifiers

Can use: inhibits, helps fight, resists, reduces, or helps prevent

APPROVED Secondary Qualifiers

Can reference: the effects of nonpathogenic bacteria such as staining, odors and/or product deterioration

APPROVED Terminology Examples

Antimicrobial, Cleaner, Fresher, More Durable

PROHIBITED Primary Qualifiers

Cannot use: kills, stops, prevents, or eliminates

PROHIBITED Secondary Qualifiers

Cannot name: specific microorganisms (i.e. S. aureus or E. coli).

PROHIBITED Terminology Examples

Antibacterial, Hygiene, Cross Contamination, Illness-Causing, Foodborne Illness

EXAMPLE CLAIMS

- Products enhanced with Microban® antimicrobial protection stay cleaner, fresher and more durable for longer.
- Products featuring Microban® antimicrobial technology will actively reduce the growth of bacteria 24/7 and for the product's expected lifetime.
- Microban® antimicrobial technology is built into products an added level of product protection against the growth of bacteria.
- Products with built-in Microban® antimicrobial protection are easier to clean and stay cleaner in between cleanings.
- Microban® antimicrobial product protection helps prevent the growth of bacteria on the surface of products that can cause premature product degradation.
